### **SUTTER COUNTY WEB SITE WINS NATIONAL AWARD**

Reno, NV, September 28, 2006 — The National Association of Government Webmasters (NAGW) awarded the Sutter County Web site its Excellence Award for Design and Usability at its recent annual conference in Reno, NV. The Sutter County site was selected from over 50 entries from 22 states. It was selected by a peer judging panel that noted the site's ease of use and friendly design. One judge commented:

*"...a top notch site. Powerful, functional and aesthetically excellent..."*

The Sutter County site won a Pinnacle Award in 2005.

The Pinnacle Awards recognize the highest scoring local government Web sites in all three judging criteria: design and usability, programming, and strategic innovation. Excellence Awards are given to the highest scoring entries in each individual criteria.
