The FLIP program goals were measured by the following core evaluation components: Program Attendance Report: Session attendance and data on the percentage of returning families was recorded; Family Intake Survey: Records participants' demographics such as age, ethnicity, and languages spoken in the home. In addition, families were asked what community resources and type of early education program the family currently accesses, the frequency of play dates and at-home activities, as well as how much knowledge the parent/caregiver had about children's developmental stages. Family Exit Survey: Completed at the end of sessions, exit surveys gathered strengthening families protective factors in parental resilience, social connections, knowledge of parenting and child development, concrete support and social and emotional competence of the child. Additional questions were customized for content, and some questions were the same as on the Family Intake Form.

The Families Learning in Play program served 257 children at various sites in 2016 over a six-month period. Nearly all (96%) of the children enrolled in sessions returned to attend two or more of the "classes." One evaluation results indicated through the family intake and followed by the exit survey asked parent to rate their knowledge of their child's developmental stages and/or milestones. The results indicate that before program sessions, parents overall rated at 60%. The end-of-sessions percentage overall rose to 80 percent, "extremely" statistically significant, illustrating that the sessions were successful in imparting knowledge to parents in this area. Another evaluation results indicated through the exit survey, was the strengthening families protective factors in building social connections. Asking the parent/caregiver if they had met and built social connections with other parent in the class rated at 74%, with children at 65%.

The Bright Futures program provides monthly, no cost health and development screenings for children aged 0-5, residing in Sutter County. 181 children received health and development screenings. Compelling service outcomes: Between eight and 15 percent (depending on the sub domain) of the children assessed scored in the High-Risk category and between 12 and 18 percent of the children assessed scored in the At-Risk category.

Provide the comparison data used to determine whether the service outcome was an improvement and specify the origin of the data.

In national norms, five percent of children fall into the High-Risk category of each sub domain, meaning they need further assessment. Between eight and 15 percent (depending on the sub domain) of the children assessed at Bright Futures scored in the High-Risk category and nationally ten percent of children fall into the At-Risk category. Between 12 and 18 percent of the children assessed at Bright Futures scored in the At-Risk category. These data clearly validate the need for the ASQ-3 tool.

While 15 percent of children nationally are overweight or obese, 33 percent of the children screened at Bright Futures fell into these risk categories.

Forty percent of children required a referral; most common referrals were for oral health and hearing. An analysis of referrals showed that 25 percent of referrals were successfully accessed.

New Adventures Preschool successfully implemented a school garden into their preschool as a result of Sutter County Children & Families Commission funding. The school garden has promoted curriculum that encompasses all learning modalities in science, technology and engineering, art, mathematics and vocabulary building. The preschool children assisted in the engineering of the planting boxes, have learned to care for the garden, create compost from lunch and snack scraps and have developed a strong understanding of the importance and effects of water, sun and shade. The students observed the release of lady bugs, the growth and care of hornworms, the metamorphosis of painted lady butterfly larvae, behavior of red worms at work and garden snails. The tracked their growth and change and learned the importance of insects in the garden environment.

- Staff saw an unduplicated count of 181 children.
- Majority of parents said they learned something at the Bright Futures events that helped them to be a better parent.

Child Development Initiative

Child Development Behavioral Specialist conducted 29 home visits to teach and model new skills and to coach parents in implementing learned behavioral strategies to manage their children's behavior..

Special Needs: Children and Families Support Services

- The results of the Retrospective Parent Survey revealed that case-managed families showed a significant increase in measured confidence in advocating for their children demonstrating that program participation did what it was designed to do; increase parents' ability to advocate for their children.

Lessons Learned

- 100% of childcare educators would recommend the class to other providers.
